centers studied This book will be useful to people who are operating or considering operating day care programs to teachers and to parents who are attempting to choose a day care center for their children or evaluate a center their children presently attend As the authors explain Our intent is not to propound hard and fast rules but merely to point out what s working for others and might prove helpful to you

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
