India's Social Landscape Pushpendra, 2026-04-21 This book examines some of the social dimensions of Indian society and the challenges therein. It explores various themes including the rules and norms governing people's lives, the rhythm of village life, mythology and folk narratives, as well as social structures, institutions and processes like caste, class, gender, religion, family, formation, conjugality, dialect, language, dichotomy and the Indian diaspora. Written in honour of Professor Hetukar Jha, renowned for his pioneering contributions to historical sociology and the integration of historical methods with sociological analysis, this collection presents theoretical and empirical articles examining India's complex social landscape. The contributors explore fundamental questions about Indian society's cultural dynamics, the interplay between tradition and modernity, evolving norms and values, and the manifestation of social cohesion and conflict across gender, caste, class, and religion. The book addresses transformations in key social institutions like marriage and language while representing India's spatial diversities and distinct regional cultural practices across its vast geographical expanse. The chapters take a long view on social transformations since India confronted Western modernity during British rule and the post-independence period up to the present era of globalisation and liberalisation. The book will be of interest to research scholars and faculty in the fields of sociology, social anthropology, cultural studies, gender studies, Dalit studies, literature, South Asian studies, and political science.

Experiencer Subjects in South Asian Languages Mahendra K. Verma, K. P. Contributing scholars investigate this feature in such languages as Marathi, Bhojpuri, Sinhalese, Marwari, Oriya, Punjabi, Bengali, Kalasha, Gujarati, Bepali, Maithili, and Malayalam. The experiencer subject not only defines South Asian languages as a linguistic unit but also has implications for theoretical linguistics. Mahendra Verma is a professor of linguistics at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Tara Mohanan is a linguistics professor in the English department of the National University of Singapore.

Hindu Approach to Indian Economy Bharat Jhunjhunwala, 2005 This book makes a path-breaking effort to build two bridges. The first bridge is between the Hindu tradition and modern economics. The author holds that the market system is consistent with the Hindu tradition. However, it should be actively controlled by the state in public good. The second bridge is between Hindu tradition and socialist politics. The socialist paradigm does not ensure that the socialist leadership will work in the interests of the people. The only motivation for it to do so would be spiritual growth. The socialist leaders may work for social good only when this spiritual objective is placed before them. The book calls for an end to this schism in the soul of India and builds a new vision that is Hindu, socialist, and market-oriented at the same time. *'Muslim Woman'/Muslim women* Patricia Jeffery, Kaveri Qureshi, 2024-11-25 This book addresses South Asian Muslim women's lived experiences whilst questioning dominant concepts of agency. Negative homogenising constructions of the Muslim Woman are not the result of a knowledge deficit but constitutive of Euro-American and Hindu nationalist forms of civilizational self-assurance. Portraying

the richness and diversity of Muslim women's voices and agency cannot therefore rectify discourses casting Muslim women as invisible or silent so long as the vision of agency is shackled to dominant feminist precepts. Mindful of this problem, the book examines Muslim women's legal agency with respect to the family, their claims making upon the state, livelihoods, and the impact of male outmigration on left-behind wives. Working across these domains of everyday life, contributors highlight how women's vulnerabilities within their families dovetail with oppressions experienced in the local state, the labour market, and in the streets. Women's economic locations continue to shape their agency in crucial ways, with upward mobility often entailing greater restrictions on women's mobility and independence, yet the chapters caution against romanticising the ironic independence of poverty. Collectively, this volume showcases Muslim women's diverse identities and desires that may be sidelined in dominant concepts of agency. This book will be beneficial for scholars and students of South Asian Studies interested in gender justice, politics, and the intersection of religion, culture, and identity. This set of multi-reference works is meant to be read together as the five volumes interlace one another like the laces of a shoe in the famous painting by Vincent van Gogh, *Who will wear the shoes?* is a question long debated in art history and philosophy. As a result, this volume showcases a broad spectrum of critical storytelling from geographically diverse authors working in universities, small businesses, and public service throughout Brazil, Canada, Finland, the United Kingdom, and the United States. To reflect these dynamics and for the stories in this volume to fit together, chapters were organized into three themes: stories of processing history, tales of history as method, and narratives of history through a business opportunity. Volume 3 features stories that reflect the exacerbated inequalities of race, gender, and income across the world.

These inequalities and power relations remain continuously contested particularly in these trying times despite being captive to a particular economic ideology built on the premise of exploitation and subjugation. The stories told in this volume tell against the orthodoxy of the colonizer and the seemingly powerful. They are organized as stories of resistance, emancipation, and transformation. They invite us to rethink the multiple ways to restructure power relations between the colonizer and the colonized and open up spaces for the marginalized, underprivileged voices. Volume 4 is designed to create a new business storytelling paradigm that critically approaches business narratives that have historically privileged a corporate agenda. It explores the various ways that images of the other in business are developed, presented, and accounted for through powerful and dominant narratives. The stories in this volume collectively help readers to understand, resist, and provide strategies for change through various analyses of how business narratives come to develop, get written, are legitimized, are challenged, and get changed over time. Volume 5 brings together the practices specific to the socioeconomic approach to management, SEAM. SEAM is a method of change management developed through research interventions carried out in more than 2,000 companies and organizations since 1975. This method is systemic; it considers the whole company and tends to simultaneously increase social and economic performance by focusing mainly on the development of human skills and behaviors, making it possible to reduce dysfunctions and recycle hidden costs into added value.
